SHE WAS ONE OF THE MOST DEDICATED STAFF MEMBERS OF BEYOND THE BELL AND A LOYAL FRIEND TO ME FOR MANY YEARS. FOREMOST, BETTY WAS A TRUE SERVANT OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST AND A WONDERFUL MOTHER TO HER ONLY SON. PLEASE KEEP HER FAMILY AND THE BEYOND THE BELL FAMILY IN YOUR PRAYERS.

WE ARE ALSO INCREDIBLY GRATEFUL FOR OUR COALITION MEMBERS WHO ATTENDED OUR ANNUAL COALITION RETREAT JUNE 22-23, 2021, IN MACON, GEORGIA.
